Treasurer's Report

2020 has been a challenging year for the MCC with regards to finances. When the coronavirus hit in March, the MCC and library followed state and local guidelines and closed their doors. As a result, the revenues for 2020 are well below what had been projected. However, due to careful management of funds, the MCC has been able to continue operating. Limited activities have resumed while remaining compliant to COVID-19 regulations. The Washington Valley Library remains closed, per guidance from the Somerset County Library System.
